# **ORIGINS**



For the benefit of new boys and others who read this brochure for the first time, a short history of the origins, aims and objectives of the Mal de Mer Club will provide a useful grounding for the forthcoming trip.

In the early 1930s, W. H. Gould (Uncle Jimmy) was working in Plymouth as a Branch Manager for an Insurance Company. On one of his trips to Scilly he got into conversation with certain of the Island's sportsmen and the subject of sport on the Islands was the topic for discussion. Opportunities for playing competitive sport on the Islands were limited so Uncle Jimmy offered to bring over a team of sportsmen who would play the Islanders at whatever game they chose.

In September 1932 the first party arrived and, with the exception of the war years, has been coming ever since.

Uncle Jimmy died in 1977 but the Island sportsmen from those early days remain very dear friends.

The objectives set by Uncle Jimmy from the first trip remain clear today - to encourage and foster sport and sportsmanship both on and off the field and particularly, in the Isles of Scilly, to encourage good fellowship with the Islanders, good feeling in its membership and a willingness to have a go when called upon.

A word of warning to new members, the Mal de Mer Club is not a democratic organisation, it is a benevolent junta comprising the President, Organizator and Director General with the opinions of the Treasurer thrown in for good measure. Do not question its authority, we have lost too many good men at sea!

# MERIT TROPHY




At each Guest Night Dinner we ask the Head Teacher of the School to announce the School's recommendation for the recipient of the Mal de Mer Merit Trophy for

# **JACKIE WILLIAMS**

# First Mal de Mer Merit Award winner - 1956

Captain of rugby and athletics at Truro school which he went to after leaving Carn Thomas School, St. Mary's, Scilly. Captained Cornwall under-19 rugger side on S. Wales tour. Selected for England under-19 final trial squad.

At Truro, won scholarship apprenticeship to de Havilland Aircraft Company. Studied for mechanical engineering degree at Bournemouth Technical College while working at de Havilland factory at Christchurch and later Hatfield, Herts.

Year's design work with Holst and Company, Watford after registering with Federation of Civil Engineering Contractors, then in Corby with Stewarts and Lloyds (later British Steel Corp.)

1965 with Jamaican wife went to Jamaica to work with Public Works dept. in Kingston. (Four years building roads, bridges, public buildings). For next 16 years worked for variety of overseas companies on projects ranging from highrise hotels to sea defences and irrigation systems. Operated own design and supervision consultancy.

During his 20 years in Jamaica continued playing rugby. Captained national Jamaican

XV throughout Caribbean, including winning Caribbean Tournament in Barbados in 1975. Played 'Golden Oldies' rugger, too in International festival at Long Beach, California in 1981. Keen scuba diver.

In 1985 left with new Jamaican wife and two children to set up fibre glass company in Australia. Arrived winter-time during hard times and recession. But 'Golden Oldies' rugger strong there. Played every week and attended international festivals in Perth, Christchurch (New Zealand) and Dublin with his team.

Returned to engineering in 1992. Got relief contract at Department of Works in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea. This was followed by a year's extension and then three year contract. Worked entirely on roads and bridges.

Travelled extensively throughout the country, usually by light aircraft/chopper/boat.

1996 offered job of managing Port Moresby office with major Australian consultants. Next four years spent in range of projects including planning a complete new town, health clinics, access roads, highways, bridges, etc.

1998 brief break from Papua for work in Micronesia for AusAID, the Aussie aid agency. While there dived on sunken Japanese WWII fleet. Joined Port Moresby Hash House Harriers (there being no 'Golden Oldies' rugby there).

2000 sent by company to East Timor to look after reconstruction of health clinics. Later back to Papua on World Bank-funded road maintenance project. Then to Aceh, Indonesia (for reconstruction after 2004 tsunami) and Maldives (more post tsunami work 2005-2007). Built completely new village on uninhabited isle for 3500 people displaced from their home island. It is 1.5km long and 0.5km wide with highest point 1.8m above sea level.


2007 offered contract Indonesia (Jakarta), travelling extensively to Sumatra and Kalimantan. "Living in Jakarta was a memorable experience," he says.

Current location, in contrast with Jakarta, is Nauru, a small, poor, very quiet Pacific Island surviving as an independent country only because of generous support from Australia. Once phosphate-rich and one of richest in the world, it's income has dwindled to a trickle because phosphate has run out.

Building secondary school there currently overlooking coral reef. "My exercise is confined to walking and jogging through the old worked phosphate mine areas and weekly Hash House Harriers runs."

"When the time comes for me to put my feet up it will probably be in northern Australia," says Jackie, "where there are no cold winters, although I will still be very much a Scillonian and will continue correcting people who call it anything other than the Isles of Scilly."
