ORIGINS



For the benefit of new boys and others who read this brochure for the first time, a short history of the origins, aims and objectives of the Mal de Mer Club will provide a useful grounding for the forthcoming trip.

In the early 1930s, W. H. Gould (Uncle Jimmy) was working in Plymouth as a Branch Manager for an Insurance Company. On one of his trips to Scilly he got into conversation with certain of the Island's sportsmen and the subject of sport on the Islands was the topic for discussion. Opportunities for playing competitive sport on the Islands were limited so Uncle Jimmy offered to bring over a team of sportsmen who would play the Islanders at whatever game they chose.

In September 1932 the first party arrived and, with the exception of the war years, has been coming ever since.

Uncle Jimmy died in 1977 but the Island sportsmen from those early days remain very dear friends.

The objectives set by Uncle Jimmy from the first trip remain clear today - to encourage and foster sport and sportsmanship both on and off the field and particularly, in the Isles of Scilly, to encourage good fellowship with the Islanders, good feeling in its membership and a willingness to have a go when called upon.

A word of warning to new members, the Mal de Mer Club is not a democratic organisation, it is a benevolent junta comprising the President, Organizator and Director General with the opinions of the Treasurer thrown in for good measure. Do not question its authority, we have lost too many good men at sea!



Back to Tregarthens for beer and medals.



OBITUARIES

It is with enormous sadness that we note the passing of four Mals since our last trip. Each will be in our thoughts and will no doubt be looking down and providing us with their celestial support.

B. E. 'Sailor' Pooley

The death of Brian Pooley marks the passing of a remarkable Mal.

From his first trip in 1970 - introduced by Paddy Hope - to his last in 2009 Brian added greatly to the fun and entertainment of the trip.

A man of wit, charm and repartee, he could usually be found at dinner on his feet making some humorous comment about the day's events to such an extent that one past President was heard to remark "Brian spends so much of his time at dinner on his feet, I don't know how he finds time to eat!"

This was, however, Brian. He was irrepressible! He became President in 1983 and organizator in 1990 and threw himself into that role as though he had been made for it, he stepped down in 2007.

Relationships with the islanders were always important to him and they too will feel a sadness at his passing. He died on the 18th April after a long fight with cancer. His funeral on the 9th May was attended by the entire Mals Hierarchy and in all some 37 Mals and seven of their wives/partners formed part of the congregation, which also included Norman and Peggy Discombe who had travelled up from St. Mary's.

Nicknamed "Sailor" because of his early working life and his continued love of the sea it was appropriate that his ashes should be scattered at sea and so on 8th July in a private boat skippered by Gerald Thompson this act was carried out by his son Jamie. The chosen spot was just off the coast of St. Mary's having views of Tregarthens, Star Castle, St. Mary's Golf Club, St. Agnes, Tresco, Bryer and St. Martins, all places dear to Brian.

Also in the boat was his beloved wife Sue and island friends Norman and Peggy Discombe.

Sleep well old friend, the battle's o'er.

G. F. Nabb (Gordon)

Gordon's first trip was in 1976 and his last was in 2009, in that period he made 28 trips having his Presidential year in 1991.

Introduced by Ben Guest, Gordon was a footballer and cricketer of considerable skill although past his best when he made his first appearance on St. Mary's. His constant wish was that he had become a Mal 10 years earlier.

A man of quiet demeanour he had a good sense of fun and thoroughly enjoyed the Mals company and the Isles of Scilly, and had the rare honour of never being fined on the trip.

He died on the 20th May after a long debilitating battle with cancer but throughout that time he remained cheerfully optimistic and looked forward to his next trip. His funeral on the 3rd June was attended by the Director General and many Shropshire based Mals, he will be missed by us all.

Martyn Woodfield

Martyn, son of Vic "Tiger" Woodfield died very suddenly last October aged 52. He was born in Plymouth and had a lifelong passion for the "Green Army" as well as Man. Utd. One of the more cerebral Mals, he graduated as a biochemist, then studied medicine before becoming a GP, basing himself in Bodmin.

Martyn was a quick, left-footed footballer and keen cricketer. He introduced and sponsored our esteemed treasurer; however, his Mals career was cut short by illness. Martyn also toured the islands with the Cornish Doctors' cricket side Methigion, maintaining his spectacularly low batting average! Martyn is survived by his wife Fiona, 3 daughters and one son who we will hopefully see on the trip one day.

December 9th, 1926 - August 2011. In his younger days Paul served on HMS Bluebell, before devoting all of his working life to Shell.

Nicknamed Caesar, Paul was a New Boy of the legendary George Twist and himself, introduced a number of New Boys to the Mals, including, amongst others, Bob Fox. This first class Mal embarked on 20 trips to the islands with the Mals between 1951 and 1982 and he will be sadly missed.











This post was created some years ago and has run smoothly for many years. Remember the duties should be undertaken responsibly. These are:

It is the duty of all Mals to respect the office of President during his year of office which commences on the island of St. Mary's and ends in the following year on the island. The President Elect shall not assume the title of President until he is flushed in. Abuse of this regulation will earn a firm rebuke or worse from the Hierarchy. Any Mal addressing the President Elect as 'President' will suffer similarly!!





MERIT TROPHY




At each Guest Night Dinner we ask the Head Teacher of the School to announce the School's recommendation for the recipient of the Mal de Mer Merit Trophy for
